SUMMARY OF OKLAHOMA OPEN MEETING LAW

A. General Rules

- 1. Applies to all public entities including committees.
- 2. Must be open meeting in a convenient location with proper public notice.
- 3. May not have casual meetings or telephone polls.
- 4. Executive sessions must be voted upon by the Board as a whole and then only for the following purposes:
 - a. hiring and firing;
 - b. labor negotiations;
 - c. purchase or appraisal of real estate;
 - d. confidential conversations with attorney.
- 5. Must have clear written minutes of each meeting.
- 6. The votes must be publicly cast and recorded.
- 7. Continuations must be announced publicly in the original meeting with the date, time and place of continued meeting publicly stated.
- 8. No "new" business at continued or special meetings.

B. Notice Requirements

- 1. Regular Meeting
 - a. Written Notice to Clerk by December 15 of the date, time and place of the regular meetings for the following calendar year.
 - b. 24 hours prior to each meeting, post a notice of the date, time place and agenda of the meeting.
- 2. Special Meeting
 - a. Written or telephone notice to the Clerk 48 hours prior to the meeting.

- b. 24 hours prior to each meeting post a notice of the date, time, place and agenda of the meeting.
- 3. Continued Meeting
 - a. Notice is given by open announcement of the date, time and place of the continued meeting.
- 4. Emergency Meeting

As much notice as possible must be given.

OTHER RULES

- 1. New business, not known or reasonably foreseen, may be taken up at regular meetings only.
- 2. 48-hour notice can include holidays, weekends, etc. We do not recommend.
- 3. 24-hour notice excludes holidays, weekends, etc.
- 4. Written minutes of all meetings must be maintained and available for public inspection.
- 5. Amendments to regular meeting notices may be made during the calendar year if done at least 10 days prior to a meeting.
- 6. Open Meeting Act does not provide for or guarantee citizens the right to participate in the governmental decisions being made at an open meeting nor does it provide citizens a right to express their views on the issues being considered at the meeting. If a public body establishes an open forum for citizens to speak, it may establish reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions. *February 24, 1999 (AG Op. No. 98-45)*

Penalties

- 1. Actions taken in willful violation are invalid.
- 2. Persons willfully violating the law are subject to fine and imprisonment.
